- 7:08 Mark Pearmain -Super Intendent
 - Increase of 1600 students in district for 2024-25 school year (down from 2200 new students last year 2023-24)
 - Greatest growth seen in high school
 - Labour shortage-some classes still pending on assigned teacher
 - District exploring recruitment incentives for teachers (TTOC don't want full-time contracts -recruitment fairs at UBC & SFU
 - Adequate TTOC—want to convert more teachers to full-time contracts
 - Device restrictions implemented--exclusions-translation & medical (elementary schools-smooth transition reported)
 - Student bussing
 - -reduced to 250 students from 1100 last year
 - -busses for students with diverse needs
 - -paid by district budget not individual school budget
 - Facilities & Capacity
 - -6 (out of 21) secondary schools implemented extended day
 -intend to add 6 more secondary schools next year 2025-26
 -November district to release report on hybrid learning options
 Notes:
 - -post secondary has 1/3rd of classes online -online learning has lots of valid concerns which will be reviewed & considered prior to implementation
 - -2025-26 year will have a small pilot project online
 - -tri-semester will be reviewed & considered
 - Portable Classrooms vs Modular Classrooms
 - -first set to open November-December
 - -2nd set for early in new year

-modular are 'technically' permanent structures with elevators & washrooms contained within

- -require occupancy permits from City of Surrey
- District municipal planning to focus on growth along Skytrain corridor -opportunity to have dual use for green spaces near schools-park & school use

Question & Answer:

-more contractors to manage grass maintenance & snow removal ---to be reviewed as contracted out to 3rd party

-bike week –highlighted the demand for more bike racks at each school as there is growing demand from students ---to explore grants/funding from Participaction & local Gov't or sponsors

-request for answers to schools 'bursting at seams' ---ongoing review of students---must also review/consider -inclusive rooms, library usage, gym & green space not just addition of classroom space by portable (temporary) or modular (permanent) structure
