4. Principal/Vice Principal Reports

- Thank you to the PAC for funding the Art Start Program and many of the field trips

Field Trip Challenges and PAC Funding

- Bus shortages and increased costs to approximately \$800/trip make field trips inaccessible to many families. The need for volunteer drivers remains due to these reasons in order to make field trips happen. Thank you to the parent drivers who have volunteered their time.
- PAC funding also helps reduce the cost per student for at least one field trip annually.
- Teachers are occasionally able to apply for special grants to cover this cost. However, the competition for the funding is extremely fierce.

School Staff Changes, Enrollment, and Schedule

- Several staff members are retiring or changing positions, with 2 more positions to be filled. Ms. Stregger will be moving to Courage Creek as their new Principal in the fall. Ms. Porter(Grade 1), Mr. Melnyk(Band), and Ms. Chapman(Librarian) are retiring at the end of the school year. Ms. Leeks will be taking on the role of the Librarian.
- Projected enrollment for 2025-26 is 453 students with 20 divisions.
- 37 students are registered for Kindergarten, only 3 below projection.
- The school is accepting registrations from Don Christian school, which is at capacity.
- Bell schedule will remain the same, with 293 minutes of instruction per day.
- Next year's schools schedule and expected fees will be posted in the upcoming Titan Times

Upcoming School Events and Activities

- The daycare program at Hillcrest will be expanding next year and will also be using one of our classrooms for Before & After School Care. This program is available to Hillcrest students only.
- Special track meet was held today
- Victoria Day on Monday, May 19th. School will not be in session
- Spring concert, produced by Ms. Budgen will be held in the school gymnasium on Wednesday, May 21st at 1pm
- School will be closed on Monday, May 26th for Professional Day
- Track and Field meet will be on June 5th at the South Surrey Athletic Park
- Sports day and Parent Appreciation Tea are set on Friday, June 13th







- K-grade 4 dance performances will be held on June 17th
- Grade 7 Band concert date to be announced. Grade 6/7 Dance group will be performing as well
- June 25th is the Grade 7 Farewell ceremony
- Hillcrest will be the hard-of-hearing hub next year, hosting a teacher who can support students with this need.

School Funding Crisis and Budgetary Constraints

- Grade 7 band will no longer be offered starting next year due to budget cuts
- Surrey Schools face a \$16 million dollar deficit, leading to cuts and unfilled positions due to underfunding
- Special education is underfunded by \$54 million in this year alone, resulting in reduced support for many students with academic or behavioral issues.
- -Government funding does not cover inflation or salary increases nor portables and modulars that are required to accommodate enrollment growth, impacting resources and supplies, and schools are relying on the public to put pressure on the government to provide adequate funding.
- There is a continued issue with younger students displaying a lot of hands-on behavior with the younger grades, and using rude language with the older grades. The staff have had to address students using racial slurs and bigoted comments, as this is a priority issue for Surrey schools. The parent community is encouraged to be aware and address these issues at home on a regular basis
- The front playground equipment was replaced after vandalism
